



Resilient Power Puerto Rico's approach is founded on a collaborative design process aimed at increasing access to renewable energy to build sustainable and equitable communities. In the first step, we Co-learn with our partners to identify and document communities' climate vulnerability, audit organizations' energy consumption and assess their renewable energy needs. With RPPR's Energy Auditors and our homegrown Energy Calculator, we then work to Co-design energy resilience proposals in which we determine total and critical energy loads, identify consumption reduction opportunities, and optimize solar energy system sizes. Finally, we Co-develop solar energy systems with our partners. We start by matching investors to projects and complete all stages of system installations. We then complete all stages from site assessments and preparation and technical and installation teams' procurement, through to the installation of their solar energy system, together with our partners. The process is completed with an operation and maintenance workshop that marks the handover of the systems to their communities.



More than 30 organizations have participated in workshops and training sessions as part of our **Co-learning** programs.



We have Co-designed more than 22 ready-to-fund solar energy system proposals.







We have funded 8 proposals with more than \$440k invested in 5 solar energy systems Co-developed with our partners, with 2 more in the pipeline.



SUMMER PROGRAMS 2023

This summer our Co-learning program put RPPR's Energy Calculator in the hands of 11 auditors, trained and certified in Energy Auditing. Over the course of 5 skills workshops and 5 conversations with subject matter experts, participants strengthened their understanding of work in the fields of renewable energy and sustainability. Our Auditors are now part of the team working to co-design solar energy proposals for 16 gender violence survivor centers, the Jane Stern Dorado Community Library and 8 of their satellite libraries.



ENERGY AUDITS

Step 1

Document energy consumption by creating an inventory of appliances and equipment and calculating the consumption schedule. Finally, critical loads are identified out of total consumption.



Assess opportunities to reduce consumption by changing behavior patterns or implementing energy efficiency measures. Organizations are provided with information on how alternative choices reduce their energy consumption and costs.

Step 3


Understand the relationship between energy consumption and generation for different system sizes and consumption levels. Provides the information to optimize system sizes and understand usage during blackouts.

The main Library offers computer labs, children's areas, and classrooms, 8 "satellite" libraries bring ISDCL to 5 municipalities and works with the communities to provide food, household necessities, solar lighting and access to government services following climate disasters. |SDCL provided alternative learning sites following earthquakes in 2020, and free internet and printing for public schools during the COVID-19 pandemic.
